The third quarter of 2013 has provided an opportunity for collegial visiting at our annual business meeting and advanced planning for the "Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) in Health and Wellness" research workshop SIG-Health is hosting jointly with SIGHCI prior to the 2014 AMCIS conference in Savannah, Georgia. Here is the month-by-month report on SIG-Health activities.

August – The annual SIG-Health Business Meeting was held on Friday, August 16 in Chicago. Several attending board members described their SIG-Health positions and plans for the future, I introduced the 2014 "HCI in Health and Wellness" workshop we are jointly presenting with SIGHCI in conjunction with AMCIS 2014, and we hosted a good-sized group of attendees. Treasurer Ann Fruhling reports that SIG-Health financial assets have grown over the past two years to exceed \$5000, thus putting the SIG back onto a firm financial footing and enabling us to fund future member-oriented activities.

September – Planning continued for upcoming SIG-Health activities, as well as handling those pesky activities that are involved in starting up Fall Semester classes.

October – A program committee is being recruited for the "HCI in Health and Wellness" research workshop and an associated special issue of AIS Transactions on Human-Computer Interaction (THCI) under the same title.

SIG-Health board members will be present at ICIS 2013 and HICSS 2014 conferences. However, no formal SIG events are planned at this time for those events.

Inter-professional Health IT Adoption (ICHITA 2013)...**Jim Ryan**

Healthcare is not a single profession, but multiple professions that share similar domains of values and ethics, roles and responsibilities, communication, as well as teamwork and teams. In 2010, the World Health Organization (WHO) described how inter-professional education occurs when students of two or more professions learn about, from, and with each other to enable effective collaboration and improved health outcomes. In the same publication, the WHO identified inter-professional collaborative practice occurs when multiple health workers, from different professional backgrounds, provide comprehensive services by working with patients, their families, care-givers, and communities to deliver the highest quality of care across settings. Within inter-professional collaborative healthcare, the scope of healthcare practice is the intersection between individual clinician competency and integrated inter-professional competencies. To this end, health IT adoption must enhance both the scope of practice and evidence-based practice at the point-of-care from the individual clinician, integrated inter-professionals, and patient perspectives.

During mid-October, I attended the International Conference on Health Information Technology Advancement, hosted by Western Michigan University. The conference was very informative, with most of the conference keynotes and plenary sessions focused on health IT innovation, adoption, and engagement. One particular plenary session presentation from Elsevier Clinical Solutions addressed the critical reality that the commitment to automate is very different from the commitment to transform cultures and scope of practice at the point-of-care. Moreover, desired health IT adoption and related outcomes are only achievable as point-of-care transformation takes place and transformation efforts begin with clarity on day-to-day realities at the point-of-care provided by inter-professional healthcare clinicians.

As patient engagement becomes a priority in healthcare, it is clear that IT innovations can help bridge the gap as illustrated with current IT apps and healthcare devices available today. However, as technology professionals know, IT adoption success requires acceptance at the point-of-care by healthcare inter-professionals and patients alike. Elsevier Clinical Solutions provided one solution through a clinical practice model framework for sustainable healthcare transformation that



covers concepts of: (1) intentional design, (2) evidence-based practice, (3) action orientation, (4) outcome production, (5) replication, (6) capacity building, (7) technology enabled, and (8) scalability.

I congratulate Drs. Sharie Falan and Bernard Han on a very successful conference. ICHITA 2013 provided a relevant and insightful perspective to inter-professional health IT innovation, adoption, and engagement. I believe these perspectives are timely, especially to Western Michigan University as they prepare to open their new medical school in fall 2014. I also believe these perspectives to be relevant to the joint research workshop between SIGHealth and SIGHCI planned for AMCIS 2014.

Call for Papers on Human-Computer Interaction in Health and Wellness

- 2014 Research Workshop Jointly Hosted by Association for Information Systems (AIS) SIGHealth and SIGHCI
- Special Issue of AIS Transactions in Human-Computer Interaction

IMPORTANT DATES:

- Research Workshop Submissions Due from Authors: May 1, 2014
- Acceptance Notifications Will Be Returned to Authors by: June 15, 2014
- Workshop Camera Ready Papers Due from Authors: July 15, 2014
- The Research Workshop will be hosted in conjunction with AMCIS 2014 in Savannah, GA, USA and is scheduled to be held on Thursday, August 7, 2014

RESEARCH WORKSHOP OBJECTIVE:

The research workshop promotes the creation and refinement of scholarship that addresses the intersection of Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) and Health and/or Wellness fields. Several selected papers from the workshop will be invited for further development toward publication in a special issue of AIS Transactions on Human-Computer Interaction (THCI) to be titled "HCI in Health and Wellness".

All related research topics and methods are welcomed; priority will be placed on selecting papers that:

- Clearly address topics relating to HCI and Health and/or Wellness
- Incorporate development and/or empirical evaluation of theory that is testable (i.e., falsifiable)
- Are submitted in substantially complete form

RESEARCH WORKSHOP COST:

There will be no charge for invited authors to attend the workshop.

RESEARCH WORKSHOP FORMAT:

Workshop participants will discuss their work in small groups led by scholars with editorial experience in the areas of HCI, health, and wellness. Discussions will be facilitated so that each author has equitable time to receive feedback. This



structure provides opportunity to strengthen the submitted papers for future journal submission.

SUBMISSION, REVIEWING, AND ACCEPTANCE PROCESSES:

- Submit papers as email attachments in Microsoft Word or Adobe Acrobat (PDF) format to Vance Wilson (vancewilson@gmail.com). Expect your submission to be acknowledged within 48 hours.
- All reviewing will be conducted in double-blind format and will be primarily performed by program committee members selected for expertise and interest in the topic area.
- Notification regarding acceptance of your submission will be sent via email to the submitting author.
- Because this is a workshop rather than paper publication venue, there is no restriction on concurrent submission of manuscripts to a conference (such as AMCIS) or a journal.

SUBMISSION FORMAT:

Ideal papers will be no more than 35 pages in length (maximum 8000 words), double spaced, in 12-point Times New Roman font, following THCI guidelines (<http://aisel.aisnet.org/thci/authorinfo.html>). Longer papers will be considered if the length is well motivated.

Dr. Chi Zhang is an assistant professor with the Department of Information Technology at Southern Polytechnic State University in Marietta, Georgia. The CPHIMS certification is awarded by the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS), the world-wide professional organization for all things Health IT. The certification demonstrates mastery of Project Management, IT Management, and Health Industry knowledge considered important to competent practice in today's healthcare information and management systems field. As of Sept. 2012, less than 3000 people in the world had achieved CPHIMS. According to HIMSS, "CPHIMS certification is fast becoming an industry standard by which individuals are assessed for new positions or promotion."
